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State law identifies the following persons in descending order of priority as legal next of kin:  
("Adult" is defined as an individual 18 years of age or older.)

### Oregon

1. An agent of the decedent
  - a. Healthcare power of attorney, unless specifically prohibited from making an anatomical gift or
  - b. Any other individual expressly authorized to make an anatomical gift on the decedent's behalf
2. Spouse (even in cases of legal separation unless legally divorced)
3. An adult child
4. A parent
5. An adult sibling
6. An adult grandchild
7. A grandparent
8. An adult who exhibited special care and concern for the decedent
9. A guardian of the decedent at the time of death
10. Any other person having the authority to dispose of the decedent's body

### Washington

1. The appointed guardian of the person of the decedent at the time of death
2. The individual, if any, to whom the decedent had given a durable power of attorney that encompassed the authority to make health care decisions
3. Spouse (even in cases of legal separation unless legally divorced)
4. An adult son or daughter
5. A parent
6. An adult brother or sister
7. A grandparent

### Idaho

1. An agent of the decedent
  - a. Healthcare power of attorney, unless specifically prohibited from making an anatomical gift or
  - b. Any other individual expressly authorized to make an anatomical gift on the decedent's behalf
2. Spouse (even in cases of legal separation unless legally divorced)
3. An adult son or daughter
4. A parent
5. An adult sibling
6. An adult grandchild
7. A grandparent
8. An adult who exhibited special care and concern for the decedent
9. A guardian of the person of the decedent at the time of death
10. Any other person having the authority to dispose of the decedent's body

### Funeral Arrangements and Eye Donation

Eye donation takes from 30 minutes to one hour. A trained technician will remove the eye and perform restorative procedures to ensure a natural appearance. On rare occasions, there might be some puffiness and bluing around the eyes that the funeral director can usually conceal. Obesity coupled with blood thinning medications such as heparin or coumadin may increase the risk of puffiness occasionally associated with eye donation.
